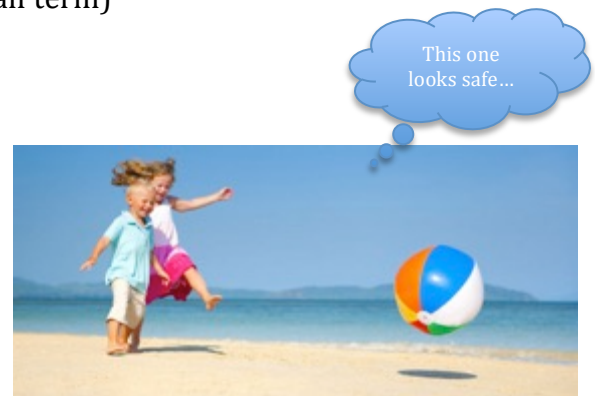

STOP PRESS: A warning message from Mr Ferrar:

The Harlequin Ladybird



This is an alien species which first appeared in the UK only in 2004 but has now spread across much of southern England and into the Midlands.

There are numerous colour and pattern forms but it is generally a larger species than most of our native ladybirds, around 8 mm long, with a dome shape.

There are three main forms of the Harlequin - *succinea*, *spectabilis* and *conspicua*. However, each of these three forms show large amounts of variation within them.

A bodybuilder has revealed how doctors were concerned for his life after he was bitten by a ladybird.

Reza Rezamand, 31, developed sepsis after being bitten by one of the insects causing his foot to swell up to twice its normal size and toes to turn black.

The incident left the 6ft1inch weightlifter feeling 'lucky' to be alive and he is now trying to raise awareness of the potential deadly consequences of one of the bites.

He said: 'I want to raise awareness about this and tell anyone who might have suffered a similar bite to go to the doctor straight away.'
